It all began with a phone call from Harry Straub. He was calling the Pastor to find out why the taxes were raised on property owned by the Conference. It was thought that the property was a long way out in the "bushes" and was not thought about until Harry got a new and "improved" tax bill. [Yes, the Conf. must pay taxes on vacant property. When a church building goes up the taxes are waived.]

Pastor Maehre was quite curious and went ASAP to the county office to investigate. He found that the Conference property was a little over a mile north of Cedar's head Elder's home, Antonio Perez. That news was just too exciting to keep quiet. The church has been feeling cramped in their current facility for some time and we needed to think about building or renting another larger building quickly.

We had no idea it would work out this way. God works in wonderful ways. Thanks to our former head elder, Dean Ruddle we now have a large sum committed for a building project. Red Cliffs Building Project

The Red Cliffs Building Committee met and discussed the need for a Church Building, it's size, and parking lot size. The bottom line of all the discussion is that they estimate that it would take over \$2,000,000 for the land, building and parking.

Now we are talking about miracles! We only have about 1/4th of that amount right now. So, we are in need of a major miracle from the Lord and careful planning to have our own church building in or around St. George, UT.

We are therefore appealing to you to not only donate to this fund (which is growing) but to encourage friends and relatives to be part of this wonderful miracle.

Land prices have escalated here in the St. George area beyond what anyone would have expected. \$250,000 per acre is common and in many places the price is higher. So we have a lot to pray about. We solicite your prayers on our behalf.

Healthiest group in USA

A few years ago ... "The Saturday Evening Post" called Seventh-day Adventists "the healthiest group of people in the country." "Adventists have supplied the world with some rather impressive medical statistics," the popular magazine said. "Male Seventh-day Adventists aged 35 to 40 have a 6.2-year longer life expectancy on the average than the general population.

Female members have a 3.1- year greater life expectancy. Male subjects 55 and over who eat meat six times a week or more are twice as likely to die of heart attacks as are some of the Adventist vegetarian men, as shown by surveys.

Not only do Seventh-day
Adventists have fewer heart attacks, they
also have less cancer — 50 percent less
than the general population. Their rate of
lung cancer is only 21 percent of the
expected rate and their colon-rectal cancer is
60 percent less than expected. Educationmedical as well as general-receives strong
support from Adventists. Three times as
many members have completed college
compared to the general population," the
Post says.

In her book, Living with Love, Josephine Robertson tells a story. "In 1883, a youthful clergyman, the Rev. Joe Roberts, arrived by stagecoach in a blizzard to minister to the Indians of Wyoming.

This great, wild area had been assigned to the Protestant Episcopal Church by President Grant. Soon after Joe Roberts arrived, the son of the chief was shot by a soldier in a brawl, and **Chief Washakie** vowed to kill the first white man he met.

name. When Washakie appeared, Roberts opened his shirt.

"I have heard of your vow," he said, "I know that the other white men have families, but I am alone. Kill me instead."

The chief was amazed and motioned him into his tent. "How do you have so much courage?" he asked. Joe Roberts told him about Christ, His death, His teachings.

They talked for hours. When Joe left, the chief of the Shoshones had renounced

his vow to kill and resolved to become a Christian. Washakie had seen love in action.

Every group that calls itself Christian would do well to decide what it should do to make love visible in the home, church, community, and world. For unless love becomes visible it is not love at all.
